We have had 183 new members join to date in 2011. This represents a 68% increase from the same period last year. In addition, 89% of our members have renewed in 2011 which represents a significant increase from the 82% for last year. Total membership is 689 and has more than doubled from 337 on 12/31/07.

I am happy to report that on Saturday Dec 3, 2011, the last piece of siding went up on the new storage building. This project would not have been possible without the selfless dedication of Pete DeSantis. Pete stepped up early on in the planning phase of the project to lead the construction effort. Pete's construction expertise and an eager bunch of volunteers completed the majority of the work on the building's shell in only six weekends.

The amount of effort and enthusiasm put forth by our crew of volunteers never ceased to amaze me. I was most impressed with our volunteers back in October. That Saturday, the last nail went into the last shingle as the first flakes of the October Nor'easter started to fall. Now that is dedication!

The idea for the building came about in early 2010 while developing a 5 year improvement plan for the club. It became clear that a central storage facility that could act as a distribution point for electrical power would be a great asset to the club.

The most notable use for the new building will be the storage of our new 5 Stand Sporting Clay System and the ability to purchase and store clay pigeons to support both 5 Stand and Trap in more economical volumes. In addition, every discipline in the club will benefit from the new building in the next few years.

Parking Lot Expansion

CCSSEF Indoor Range Update

Since we reported on the indoor range in the last newsletter in July, planning for the new indoor range complex has been proceeding at a good pace. The 2011 30/30 Gun Raffle and the Savage Rifle Raffle provided some funds to proceed with. Many thanks go to all those who purchased raffle tickets to support this indoor range endeavor.

Recently the CCSSEF Executive Council approve expenditure of funds to get both a wetlands delineation and a topo survey completed, both of which are required before we can decide where the building and parking spaces can be located. Jonathan Sisson, a member of CCF&GC volunteered to do the wetlands delineation for us at no charge saving us an estimated \$800. Thanks Jonathan! We have contracted with David Bergeron of Brickstone Land Use Consultants to assist the Foundation in development of the range and working with all the external agencies for permits, attending planning board meetings, and etc.

Ed Csege has taken the lead on coordination with Brickstone and others as necessary and will be our Project Manager. Once we decide where the building and parking spaces can be located, based on the wetlands delineation and topo surveys, we can begin with applying for permits. We do have a tentative building plan in mind based on all of the meetings we held to gather input from the different possible users of the facilities. When all of the permits are completed we will need to hire an



CCSSEF Donation for Five Stand Equipment

I am happy to announce that Ron Coburn has donated money to the CCSSEF Foundation to purchase the equipment for a Five Stand system. Please thank Ron when you see him at the range. Thanks Ron!

The equipment arrived in early December. Seems as Pete Desantis and his merry band of volunteers who have been working hard to complete the new storage building are just in time with the final touches to the building where the equipment will be stored along with the birds to be used for the shooting events.

Five-Stand is a shotgun shooting game using sporting clays, which can be designed to fit into an existing skeet and/or trap field or any shooting range with a limited amount of space. This game offers shooters of all abilities some of the most exciting target combinations available in the world today.

The Five-Stand layouts utilize 6 or 8 automatic traps to simulate game birds such as teal, dove, quail, pheasant and even a bolting rabbit. Specialty targets such as battues and midis add even more interest for the shooter. Targets can be released in a predetermined set sequence that is clearly marked on each stand or in a sequence unknown to the shooter, where the element of surprise recreates conditions in the field while hunting.

Exciting events consist of 25/50/75 or even 100 targets, shot from 5 stands, 5 shots from each stand, with each shooter simply rotating from station to station. Depending on the skill level selected, a squad of five can shoot a round of 25 clays each in about 20 minutes.

There are endless combinations of target flights. Each time you shoot a Five-Stand event, the trap location, target elevation, target speed and target direction will be different. That's the exciting and fun challenge of shooting Five-Stand.

The shooter will be face with three types of releases:
Singles – A single target is released on the shooter command. The shooter is allowed to take a second shot if his first shot misses.

Report Double – The second target is released when the puller hears the report from the first shot.

True Doubles – Two targets are released at the same time.

This new shotgun shooting program will add a great dimension to our range facilities for our members and customers as well as provide the Foundation with a source of revenue. Joe Greathouse, Chuck Tatum and others will be writing a business plan with the details of how this equipment will be employed. The system has been in operation since early December.
